

LEED CREDITS FOR LEN-TEX CLEAN VINYL WALLCOVERINGS

Len-Tex wallcoverings with Clean Vinyl Technology (CVT) are eligible within the LEED rating system for both new construction (LEED-NC) and commercial interiors (LEED-CI) projects. In terms of evaluating LEED points with the use of wallcoverings, it is important to note that LEED rates projects, not products, therefore a product cannot carry its own LEED rating. However, the use of Len-Tex wallcoverings may contribute to LEED points in several categories. LEED credits are earned when a product or group of products are combined to achieve a specific end result (indoor air quality, recycled content, etc).

Len-Tex wallcoverings are eligible for these categories:

LEED FOR COMMERCIAL INTERIORS & NEW CONSTRUCTION

Materials & Resources

Credit 2.1 | Construction Waste Management, Divert 50% From Landfill

Recycle at least 50% by weight or volume of construction, demolition and packaging debris.
Len-Tex cores and package wraps are recyclable.

Credit 4.1 | Recycled Content

The recycled content value of a material or furnishing is determined by weight. *Len-Tex wallcoverings with **nonwoven backings** contain 10% post-consumer recycled content (of total product weight).*

Credit 5.1 | Local/Regional Materials, 20% Manufactured Regionally

Specify a minimum of 20% of building materials (by cost) manufactured (final assembly/installation) regionally within a radius of 500 miles.

For projects within a 500 mile radius of Len-Tex manufacturing in North Walpole, NH.



Low-Emitting Materials

Credit 4.1 | Adhesives and Sealants

Wallcoverings installed using compliant, low-emitting adhesives may contribute to this credit.

Len-Tex Clean Vinyl wallcoverings installed with recommended low VOC adhesives reduce indoor air contaminants and may contribute to this credit.

Pilot Credit 11 | Chemical Avoidance in Building Materials

Intended to reduce the quantity of indoor contaminants that are harmful to the comfort and well-being of installers and occupants. *Len-Tex Clean Vinyl wallcoverings, manufactured without phthalate plasticizers and halogenated flame retardants, are eligible for this pilot credit. This credit is under review and may change when included in the new LEED 2013 document.*
